WHAT ARE FLASH GROUPS?

In partnership with Sand County Foundation, American Farmland Trust is leading a coalition to launch farmer-to-farmer networks in Illinois. The Illinois FLASH program pairs farmer groups with local conservation professionals to identify and prioritize conservation needs and to provide guidance for successful implementation of conservation practices.



This collaborative effort focuses on providing FLASH groups with financial resources to fund on farm implementation of conservation practices. This unique model allows farmers to determine the needs of their local community and provide financial incentives to promote the use of conservation practices.
